South Bend physician elected to serve another term as Indiana representative at AMA meetings, proceedings

INDIANAPOLIS –South Bend’s Alfred C. Cox, M.D., a family practice physician, was re-elected by his colleagues in the Indiana State Medical Association (ISMA) to serve another term as one of their delegates to the American Medical Association (AMA).

In 1993, Dr. Cox first joined the Indiana delegation as an AMA alternate delegate, and since 1997 he has been an AMA delegate. His responsibilities, and those of the delegation, involve presenting the ISMA’s policies and positions before the AMA House of Delegates, a policy-making body.

Previously, Dr. Cox served as president of the ISMA in 1995-1996 and was also chairman of the organization’s Board of Trustees. He now begins another two-year term as AMA delegate and will attend twice yearly meetings of the national physician organization.

The election of Dr. Cox and other officers occurred during the ISMA’s 162nd Annual Convention, Sept. 16-18 in Indianapolis.

Representing approximately 8,000 of the state’s physicians, the ISMA has worked since 1849 to promote sound health care policy in the public, private and governmental sectors and to support continuing medical education for the state’s doctors.
