Kokomo doctor to serve as one of Indiana's delegates to the AMA

INDIANAPOLIS – William H. Mohr, M.D., a family physician with American Health Network in Kokomo, was elected by physicians in the Indiana State Medical Association (ISMA) to be one of their delegates to the American Medical Association (AMA). Voting occurred during the ISMA's 162nd Annual Convention, Sept. 16-18 in downtown Indianapolis.

Responsibilities of the delegates involve representing ISMA policies and positions during proceedings of the AMA House of Delegates, which meets twice annually. Dr. Mohr has been a member of the Indiana AMA delegation since 2007, completing two consecutive two-year terms as an alternate delegate.

In September 2005, Dr. Mohr completed a one-year term as president of the ISMA. Prior to that, he served as chairman of the ISMA Board of Trustees. He also served on the board of the Indiana Academy of Family Physicians and is a former chief of staff at St. Joseph Hospital. The Howard County native has also served as an athletic team physician for Kokomo Center Schools.

A graduate of Indiana University School of Medicine, Dr. Mohr completed his family practice residency at Fox Valley Family Practice in Appleton, Wisconsin. He practiced in California for two years before returning to Indiana in 1988.

The ISMA has worked since its inception in 1849 to promote sound health care policy in the public, private and governmental sectors and to

support continuing medical education for the state's physicians. Currently, the organization has approximately 8,000 members statewide.
