Indiana wins two prestigious awards from the AMA Alliance!

We made a difference about PTSD in our state and asked the country to make a difference in their communities:

At the recent AMA Alliance Annual Meeting in Chicago, the delegates adopted a policy statement in support of efforts to raise awareness of Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) and the stresses involved with military personnel and their families. States are asked to endorse this policy statement with an action at their Annual Meeting and support it with state legislators and local newspapers to raise public awareness.

PTSD has tripled among combat-exposed military. It is conservatively estimated that one in eight troops returning from overseas combat will suffer the anguish of PTSD. It will affect, literally, thousands of American citizens. There have been 200 military suicides thus far this year. Sadly, this affects the entire frailly and has a devastating impact on our communities. Locally, you can make strides in the prevention and treatment of its effect on your community, its members and future generations through the early diagnosis and compassionate treatment by the medical community.

There are several easy, high-impact, non-fiscal ways individual members and alliances can support PTSD awareness in the community:

- Write a letter to the editor.
- Contact local newspaper and offer to do an article about PTSD awareness.
- Ask your governor declare a PTSD Awareness Day by order of proclamation.
- Use the media to your advantage.
- Post a link to the PTSD screening tool on your personal or Alliance Web site.
- Urge your spouse to sponsor a resolution or policy in his/ her respective State Medical Society House of Delegates in support of the military.
- Gain the support of your state legislators; they welcome sponsorship of the military.
- Make a presentation about the PTSD Screening tool at your local Medical Society Board, and ask that the group endorse its use in your state.


