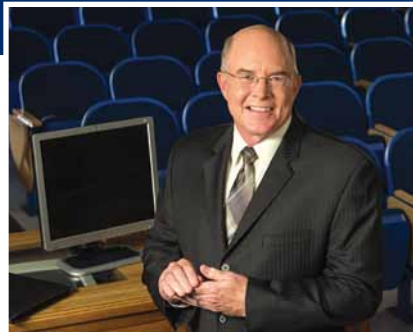
Marian University is actively addressing challenges that profoundly affect our state and nation. This year, we celebrate important milestones in our commitment to health care in the state of Indiana and beyond.



The Michael A. Evans Center for Health Sciences

Marian University is committed to improving the quality of health care and becoming a powerful force in the Indianapolis health and life sciences sectors. A powerful indicator of this commitment has taken shape during the past two years at the corner of 30th Street and Cold Spring Road.

The Michael A. Evans Center for Health Sciences is a LEED Gold building housing the most current diagnostic and research equipment available, which will enable Marian University's student-doctors and -nurses acquire real-world skills in our respected, faith-based environment.



The Marian University College of Osteopathic Medicine

This July, Marian University opens the state's second medical school, and the first in more than 100 years (Indiana University opened the Indiana University School of Medicine in 1903). The new medical school will admit 162 future doctors of osteopathic medicine each year, increasing Indiana's total number of graduating physicians by 50 percent.

The Marian University College of Osteopathic Medicine is impacting the Indianapolis and central Indiana health care and life science communities by hiring 25 Ph.D.s in biomedical science and partnering with the Indiana University School of Medicine to share resources and facilities.



The Marian University School of Nursing

For decades, Marian University has prepared excellent nurses who are highly sought after by Indiana's finest hospitals and health care facilities. This summer, the Marian University School of Nursing joins the College of Osteopathic Medicine under one roof, allowing future nurses to train alongside student-doctors in a fast-paced environment that will prepare them for success in the health care field.

Today, hundreds of Marian University graduates are nurses in Indianapolis, Indiana, and beyond. We celebrate the legacy of the Marian University School of Nursing and the impact its graduates have made on our world.

This fall, Marian University will commemorate these incredible milestones at a celebratory gala on October 18, 2013 at the JW Marriott Indianapolis.

The gala will bring together longtime Marian University supporters and health care leaders from throughout Indiana to recognize the impact Marian University will have on Indiana health care for decades to come.

Marian University, founded as Marian College in Indianapolis in 1937, is the only Catholic liberal arts university in central Indiana. It serves a student body of more than 2,500 from 31 states and eight countries through dedication to excellent teaching and learning in the Franciscan and liberal arts traditions. Marian University is one of Indiana's 31 independent colleges and one of 255 Catholic colleges and universities nationwide.

Since 2001, Marian University has been led by President Daniel J. Elsener, whose vision and leadership are transforming the university. In 2010, the university announced it would develop the first college of osteopathic medicine in Indiana; in 2011, it broke ground on the Michael A. Evans Center for Health Sciences. Marian University has amassed more than 20 national cycling championships and in 2012 won the NAIA Football Championship.
