CMS Publishes FAQs and Guidance on Grace Periods, Telehealth for Private Coverage, and Prescription Drugs

On March 24, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) is posting guidance on Payment and Grace Period Flexibilities for Issuers Offering Coverage on the Federallyfacilitated Exchanges and State-based Exchanges on the Federal Platform. Under the newly released guidance, CMS announced that it will exercise enforcement discretion to permit issuers of qualified health plans (QHPs) and stand-alone dental plans (SADPs) to extend payment deadlines for initial binder payments as well as ongoing premium payments during the period of the COVID-19 national emergency. Additionally, CMS released two Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) on the Availability and Usage of Telehealth Services Through Private Health Insurance Coverage, and on Prescription Drugs and the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) for Issuers Offering Health Insurance Coverage in the Individual and Small Group Markets.
