# New CME requirement

## SEA 225

- Begins July 1, 2019; sunsets July 1, 2025
- Indiana practitioners who apply for or renew a Controlled Substances Registration
- Must have completed two hours of approved continuing medical education on opioid prescribing and abuse

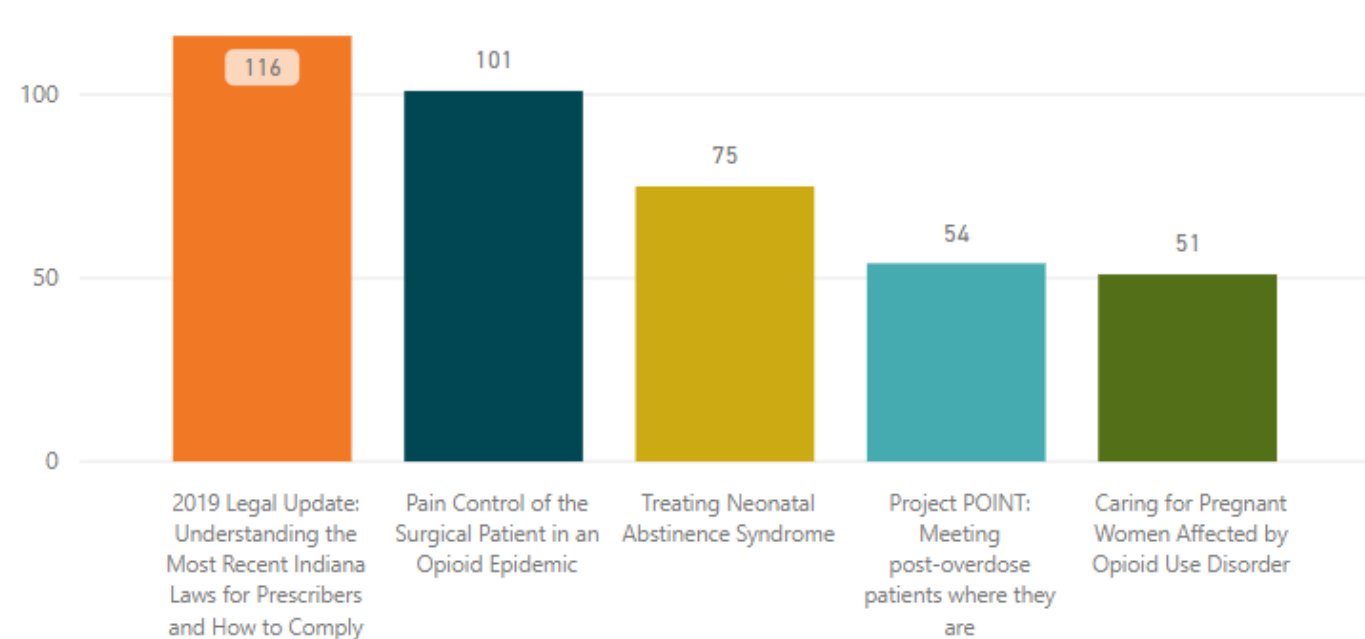

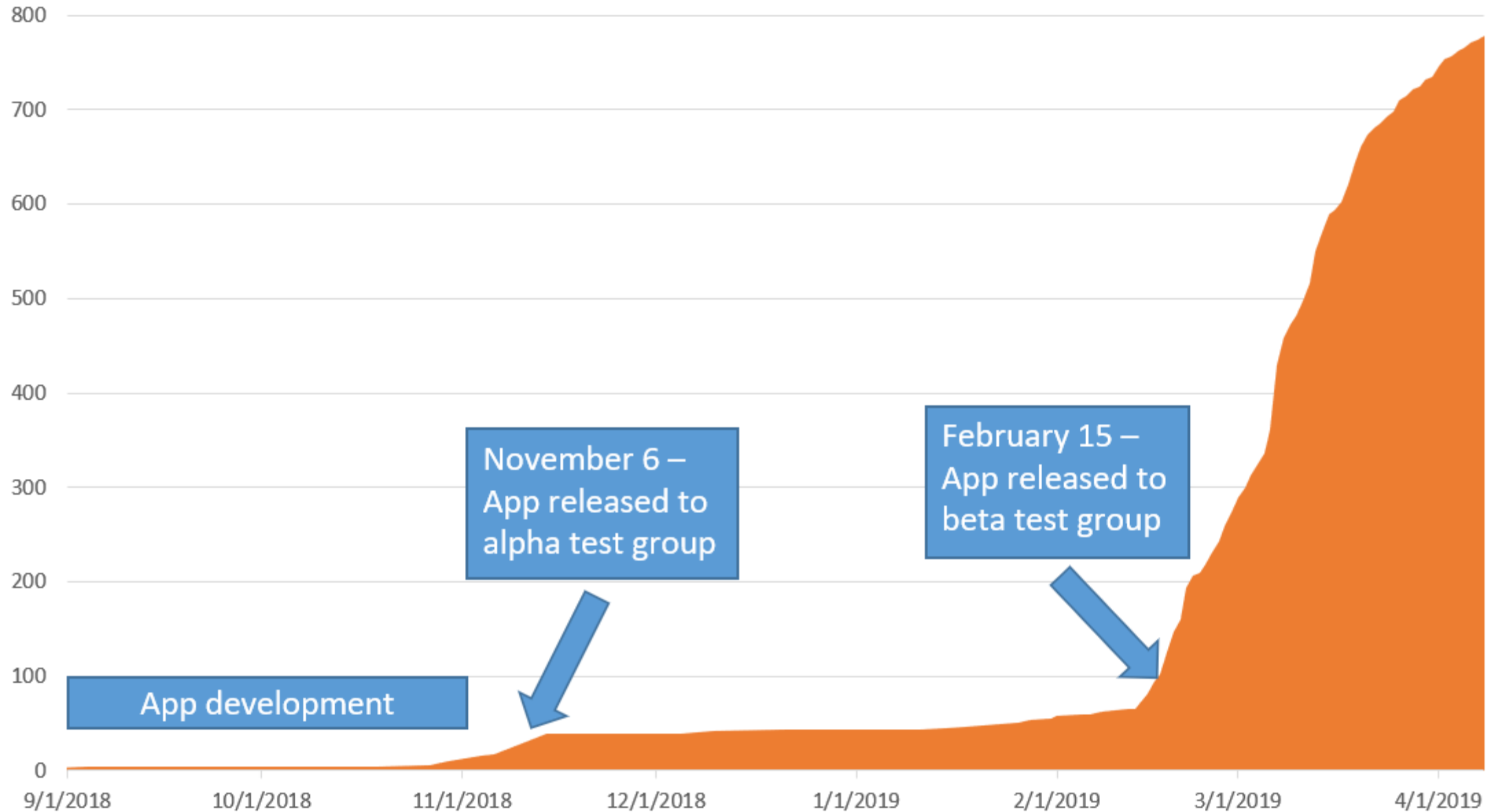
